It is not easy to get artistes of such high calibre to our more remote areas but the resulting success proves, yet again, that the artistic director, Joan Cleville, can always be relied upon to produce brilliant challenging work.

The following morning 3 of the dancers stayed onto lead a dance workshop which was outstanding – and hugely enjoyed by all who attended. It was a clever development of themes from the performance, really stimulating and creative, as we know is always the case when working with SDT each year. We look forward to the company's return.
